## 2. Introduction

RISHII aims to contribute to the modernization of Indian Higher Education System through equipping Indian Higher Education Institutions with procedures, tools, human resources and continuous professional development mechanisms necessary for Curriculum Internationalisation and creating institution-wide thriving cultures of Internationalisation-FOR-ALL. These training seminars on the four Strategic Lines for Internationalisation of Curriculum are part of RISHII capacity building plan.

## 3. Implementation of the Strategic Line 1 workshops: Internationalisation of Curriculum: why and what for?

After designing the Internationalisation workshops on the corresponding RISHII Strategic Line, the Institutional Internationalisation Teams will run them to implement that they have designed and learnt. Using the same working methodology as followed during the design stage, representatives from the International Relations Office work together with faculty members will collaborate in the preparation and facilitation of these Internationalisation Workshops.

These workshops are delivered at three different levels, depending of the target audience:

- 1) Pilot Programme-Level Internationalisation workshops, for academic and non-academic staff of the own departments. This is the audience Institutional Internationalisation Team members are familiar with.
- 2) Institutional Level Internationalisation workshops, for academic and non-academic staff from other departments of the own institution, colleagues from other disciplines or departments which means a trans-disciplinary context.
- 3) Regional Level Internationalisation workshops, for academic and non-academic staff of Indian institutions not participating in the project. This audience have a common interest in the different aspects of the Internationalisation of Curriculum and might come from different programmes, departments and institutions so the multi-disciplinary dimension is increased.

During this workshops, Level 2 Advanced Curriculum Internationalisation Champions (workshops facilitators) train workshop participants who will become Level 1 Curriculum Internationalisation Champions and will be able to identify the necessary changes and how to implement them to move forward the Internationalisation of Curriculum.

A reflection on the process will be performed after the celebration of the workshops by the Institutional Internationalisation Teams. This, together with the feedback received from the participants (following the Quality Assurance procedures described in Deliverable 5.1 *Quality and monitoring plan*) will permit to adjust and improve the Internationalisation Workshop proposals in the next Strategic Lines and to prepare successful Internationalisation-for-All Workshops (Deliverable 6.3) in the dissemination stage.

By doing this, one of the main principles of RISHII project, learning through doing, is being achieved. They implement what they have learnt during the Internationalisation of Curriculum training seminars (Deliverable 2.2) and what they have designed in Deliverable 2.3.



In the following sections, the workshops delivered are included<sup>2</sup>. Even in the project proposals the 3 different levels are defined to be celebrated separately, due to the difficulties caused by the COVID-19 situation and its high impact in India and the strict lockdowns suffered in the RISHII partner country, the possibility to celebrate one workshop covering two or the three levels was offered to the Institutional Internationalisation Teams, always considering the indicators that have to be met and adapting the contents to the different audiences.

### 3.1. University of Delhi (DU - Partner 6)

The University of Delhi celebrated on 3 and 17 July 2021 their SL1 Internationalisation Workshops focused on department, institutional and regional level using Zoom platform.

Department and institutional level were celebrated together on 3 July counting on the participation of 88 attendees: colleagues, staff and students from the departments of Physics & Astrophysics, Social Work and Law who are part of the University of Delhi-RISHII project and also colleagues, students and staff from other departments of faculty of Sciences, Social Sciences and Law of the University of Delhi.

**OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP**

This workshop relates to 'Internationalisation of Curriculum' and will focus on the philosophy behind internationalisation that can yield benefits to all students, regardless of their financial means and social capital. This training will make the participants aware of the multiple advantages that internationalised higher education programs and internationally open teaching can bring to each Indian student and to the Indian society and economy in general. It will also address the question of how international relations offices and faculty members can join their efforts in order to make all the members of their institutions (academic and non-academic staff, as well as students) aware of the need and benefits of such internationalisation efforts.

The workshop aims at improving our understanding of the concept of internationalisation of the curriculum which includes internationalisation of the formal, the informal and the hidden curriculum. It will give insights on internationalisation, globalization and formulation of international, intercultural and global elements for the curriculum. The workshop will reflect on internationalising within different cultures and practices of knowing, doing and being in the disciplines.

The workshop modules have been designed to,

- Reflect on the National Education Policy and understand the vision of the Government of India towards internationalisation of higher education.
- Reflect upon the vision of the University of Delhi towards internationalization which includes reasons for internationalising the University and the expectations from such efforts.
- Assess the need to develop a wider focus on outbound mobility, recruiting international students and virtual mobility for implementation of internationalisation at home.
- Discuss the skills, knowledge and attitude required to thrive in a changing labour market.
- Discussing the performance criteria and achievement indicators with reference to all the stakeholders of an academic institution.

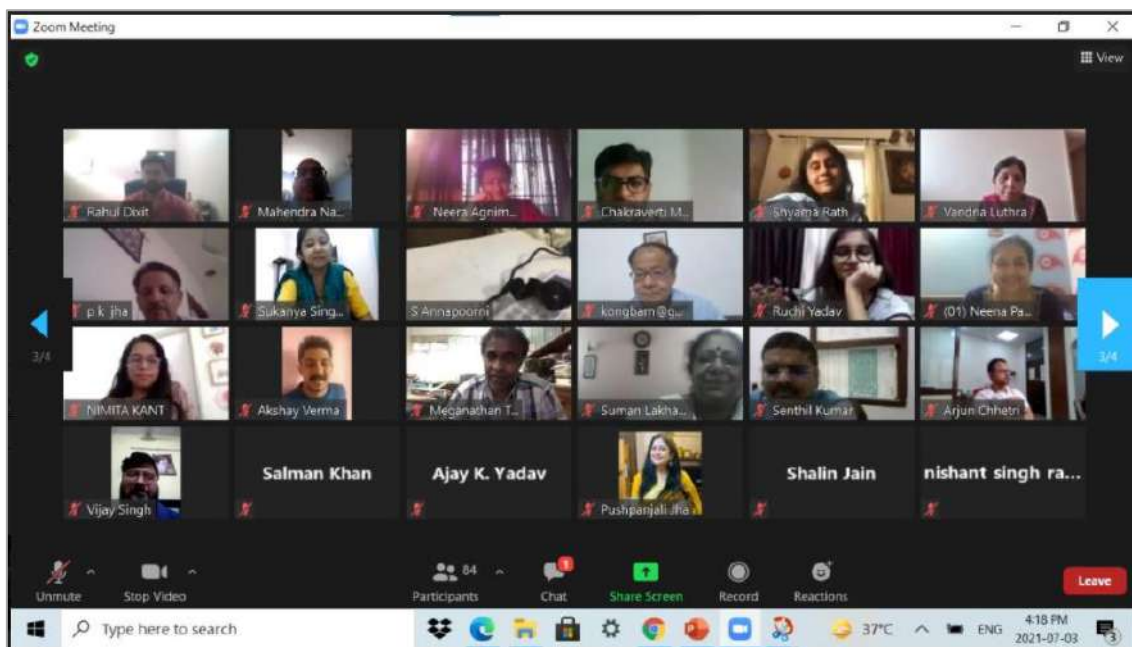


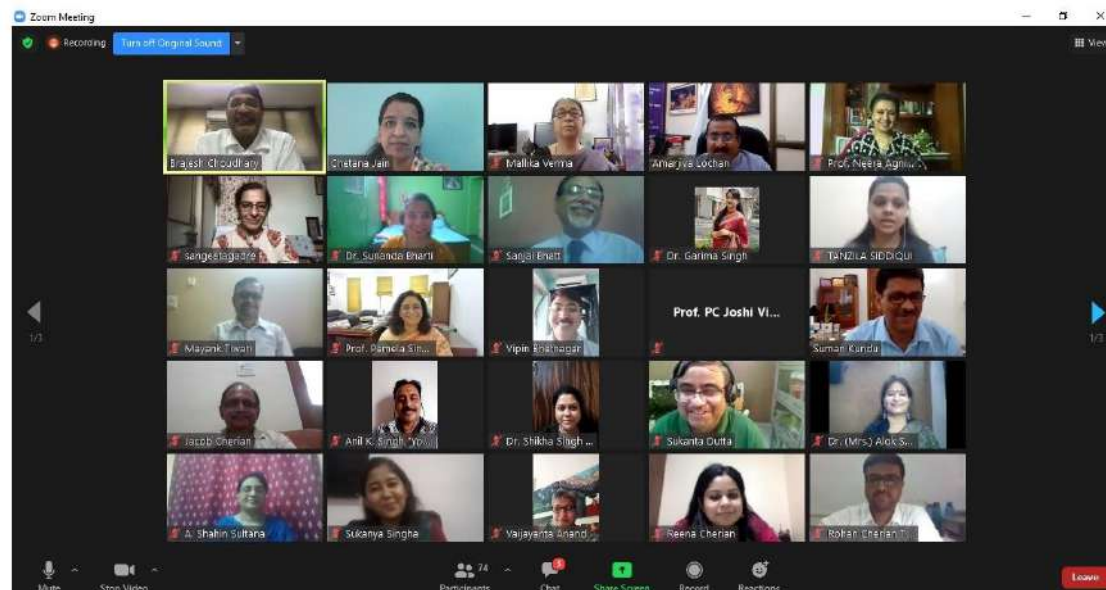


**WORKSHOP OF**  
**INTERNATIONALISATION OF CURRICULUM, July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021**  
**Saturday, 2.00 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.**

The University of Delhi (DU) under its RISHII project organised its First Workshop on Internationalisation of Curriculum. The workshop was organised on the 3<sup>rd</sup> July, 2021, Saturday from 2.00 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. Saturday was chosen to facilitate participation of the teaching faculty, non-teaching staff and the students. The duration of each session was 15 minutes followed by 5 minutes of question answers. The last session was kept exclusively for interactions and discussions. The sessions were moderated/ chaired by Prof. Brajesh Choudhary. With Q&A and discussion the interaction lasted till 7PM.

The workshop began with the **Welcome Address** by the Coordinator of the RISHII Programme from University of Delhi, **Prof. Brajesh C Choudhary**. He welcomed the 85 plus number of participants to the workshop and gave a background to the project and its objectives. This was followed by **remarks** by the Dean, International Relations, DU, **Prof. H. P. Singh** wherein he presented to the participants a comprehensive view of the University of Delhi regarding internationalisation. In **Session 1**, **Prof. Pamela Singla** presented the Rationale for internationalisation of curriculum. She gave a background to the theme, rationale and ways to achieve IoC substantiating it with examples from the University and her teaching experience. **Session 2** on Challenges of internationalization in higher education was taken by **Prof. Sanjai Bhatt**. He gave an overview of the higher education and the challenges faced in achieving IoC. **Session 3** on International, intercultural and global elements of the curriculum was given by **Dr. Sunanda Bharti**. She spoke about various aspects related to the theme including detailed coverage on the term Curriculum. **Session 4** was on Roles of agents of internationalization of curriculum delivered by Deputy Dean Foreign Students, DU, **Dr. Amarjiva Lochan**. The second half of the workshop focussed on Bridge the gap wherein gaps were identified for certain subjects after comparison amongst different countries. **Session 5** on Bridge the gap – I was delivered by Dr. Mallika Verma. **Session 6** Bridge the gap – II was conducted by Dr. Aloka Sharma. **Session 7** Bridge the gap – III was given by Prof. Sanjai Bhatt. This was followed by discussions which extended long as the participants raised many queries and had observations related to the theme. The question answers and discussions were intense as the theme is new and vibrant. The workshop concluded with concluding remarks from Prof. Pamela Singla and Dr. Sunanda Bharti and the vote of thanks by Prof. Brajesh Choudhary, the Chair. The workshop was successfully conducted and was much appreciated by the participants.

**Internationalization of Curriculum: Research**

- Internationalization of the curriculum (IoC), as a sub set of internationalization strategy, is concerned with preparing graduates to live and work effectively and ethically in an increasingly interconnected world.
- IoC is intended to make global citizens for this globalized world.
- "IoC is the incorporation of an international and intercultural dimension into the preparation, delivery and outcomes of a program of study"-Belly Leask
- "IoC is the incorporation of an international and intercultural dimensions into the curriculum as well as the teaching, learning and assessment arrangements and support services of a program of study"-Belly Leask.
- These definitions emphasize on:
  - International and intercultural dimensions of the content of the curriculum
  - teaching, learning and assessment arrangements
  - support services of the program
  - outcomes of the program of study
- Leask's definition, thus, gives emphasis not only on inputs but on outcomes also.

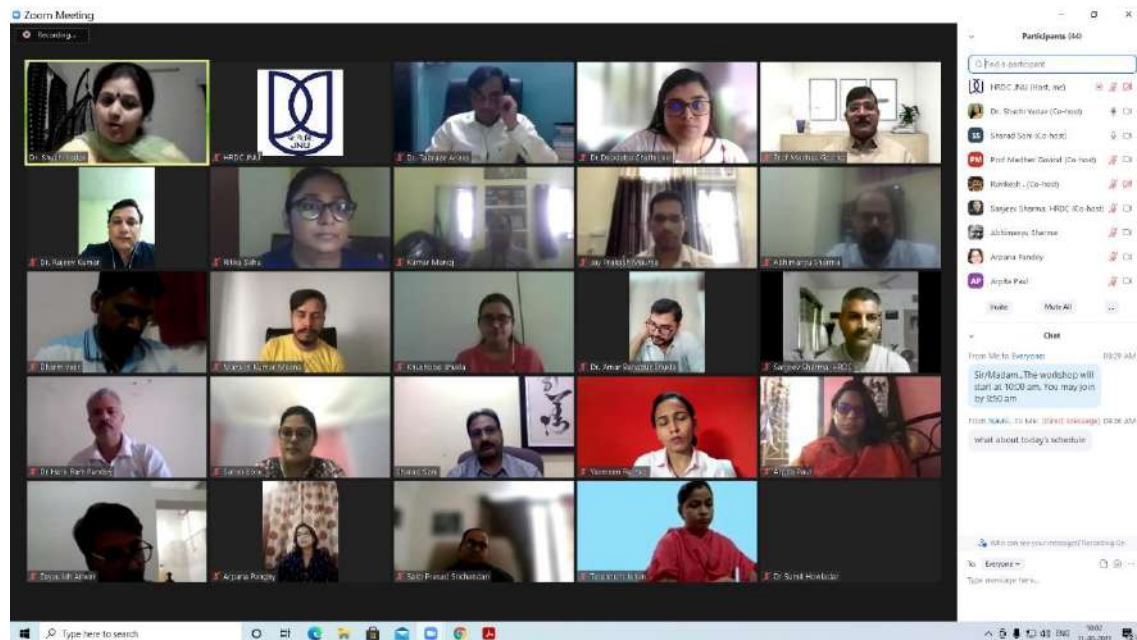

On 26 March 2022 the University of Calcutta celebrated the SL1 Internationalisation workshops including department, institutional and regional level. This event counted on the attendance of representatives from several faculties and administrative departments of the University of Calcutta and also representatives from other Indian universities, interested on learning how to design and implement an Internationalisation of Curriculum approach within the institutions.

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The captioned workshop started with the introductory speech from Prof. Rituparna Chaki, Project Lead, RISHII (Resources for Internationalization of Higher Education Institutions in India), University of Calcutta. During her brief deliberation, Prof. Rituparna Chaki highlighted on the basic objective of the RISHII project and aim of the workshop on Internationalization of Curriculum: A Strategic Approach. She outlined the background of the RISHII Project, the associated national and international project partners, capacity building in Human Resource, Institutional Internationalization Teams (IITS), specific tasks and the challenges. Citing the background of the project as an EU Strategy on India (signed 20 November 2018), Prof. Rituparna Chaki emphasized on the objective of the project which focuses on the need to work with India on internationally recognizable degrees, by focusing on Internationalization of Curriculum (IoC). Prof. Chaki concluded with an urge to form a global academic community.

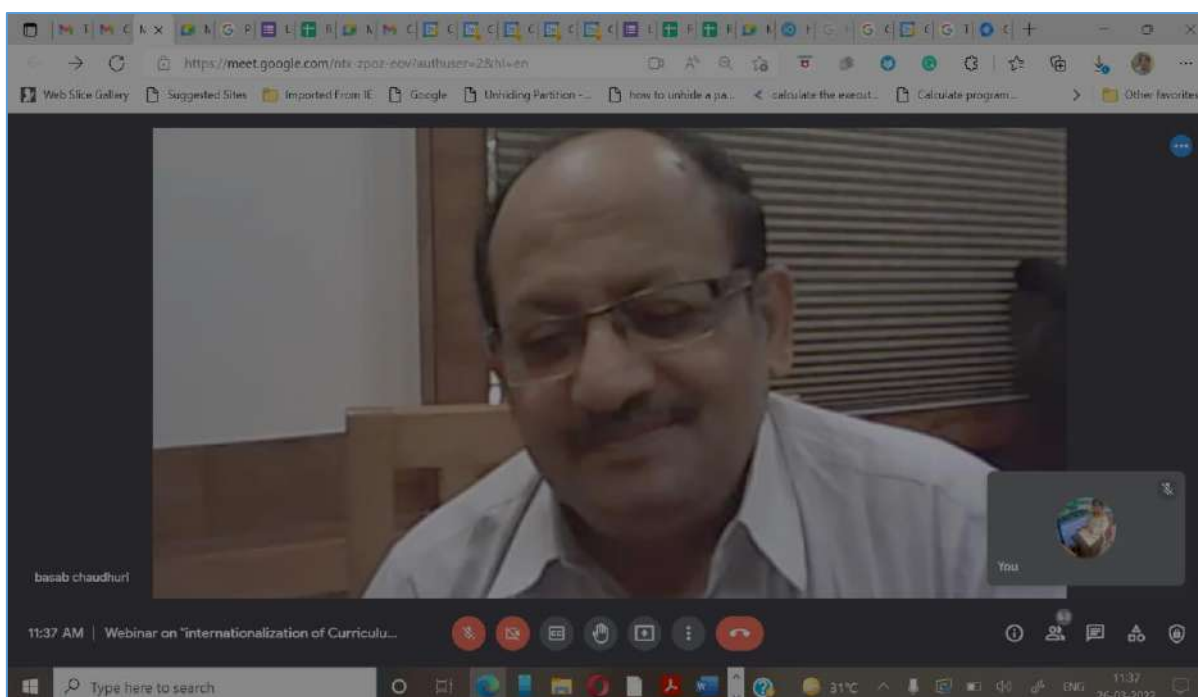
Following the introductory speech, Prof. Basab Chaudhuri, Principal, Heritage Institute of Technology, Former Vice Chancellor, WBSU, Barasat, India deliberated on National Education Policy (NEP) and its significance towards Internationalization of Curriculum. At the outset, Prof. Chaudhuri shared his three weeks experience in 2011 when he visited the institutes and universities of USA as a member of the elite team who were supported by the Neheru Fellowship with the objective of Internationalization of Education. Prof. Chaudhuri was particularly insistent on facilitating 'Learner Centric' education in India. He reminded the guidelines of the assessment and accreditation regulatory bodies like NBA where they are urging institutes/universities to engage and attract students thru Lerner Centric Learning. Prof. Chaudhuri opined that the flexibility of a Learner in choosing the content and duration of the course according his/her wish is a huge stride forward towards engaging students with international collaboration. There should be two ways mutual communication between national and international universities to create an environment of content creative study by using internet and other ICT facilities. According to him digital universities are going to increasingly pertinent in the context of internationalization of education. Sharing of local culture and idea could be pivotal in designing the international curriculum. He referred to the example of pharmaceutical industry making a huge impact on the society through Internationalization of Research and development.





As the third speaker of the day, Prof. Nabendu Chaki, Head Department of Computer Science & Engineering, University of Calcutta addressed the challenges for Internationalization of Curriculum (IOC). He referred to the example of Master in History Program and also showed his concern in pointing out how students are more prone to courses where they need to pay without judging the quality of their contents. Prof. Chaki shared his observation on the essence of defining the rubrics at an early stage during the evaluation of assignments and attainment of the objectives while designing the curriculum. He referred to case study where the lack of international standardization of the curriculum has resulted a student falling short in the marks of mathematics to pursue higher studies in Germany.

The final segment of the workshop was the Discussion Session coordinated by Prof. Sankhayan Choudhury, Department of Computer Science & Engineering, University of Calcutta. Distinguished academicians shared their valuable feedback and observation pertaining to the scope of internationalization of curriculum in Indian context. Prof. Manoj Das, Ex-Professor, NITTTR, Kolkata, Prof. Aditya Bagchi, Ex-Professor, ISI, Kolkata, Prof. Samiron Chattopadhyay, Professor, Jadavpur University, Prof. Swarnendu Sen, Professor, Jadavpur University, Prof. Subhashis Majumder, HIT, Kolkata, Prof. Radha Tamal Goswami, Techno India University, Prof. Susmita Halder, St. Xavier's University, Kolkata, Prof. Soumyabrata Saha, JIS University shared their precious insights during the discussion session. Regular organization of such workshops with more time duration was a unanimous appeal from all the participants. The workshop ended after Q/A session.

## **1. Personal Reflection - *Details of the Experience while conducting the workshop***

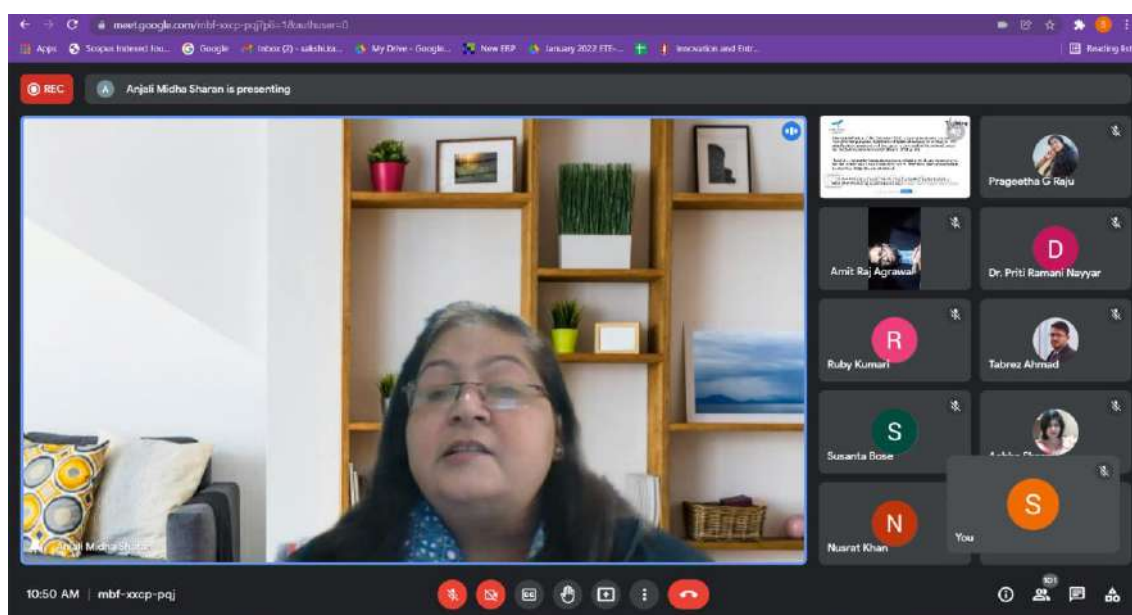
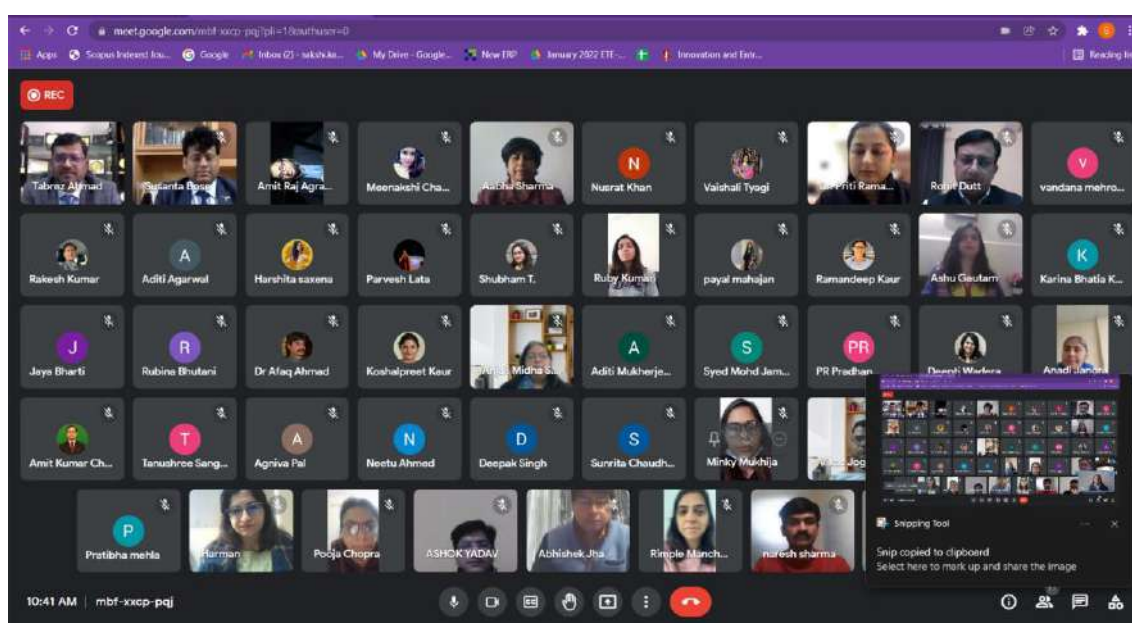
## **2. Lessons Learnt from SL 1**

### 3. Improvements to be implemented in the Future



## I Dissemination activity – July 31, 2021

### Topic- Internationalisation of Curriculum-What and Why for?

#### A Reflection Report

The first dissemination activity of the first transversal Strategic Lines (SL)-(SL1) **Internationalisation of Curriculum – why and what for?** was organized on the July 31, 2021 for the staff and students of the IIS University.

In all 176 faculty members and 167 students participated in the event.

The 9 resource persons of the different sessions were the Level 1 Badge achievers of the IISU.

The dissemination activity was planned to meet the objectives of RISHII Strategic line 1 Internationalisation of curriculum: why and what for? and covered topics related to it. Besides, the agenda was also designed in a way to give the participants an insight of the RISHII project and share with them the knowledge garnered from the project so far.

- What Curriculum Internationalisation is (and what it is not);
- Benefits and challenges of Curriculum Internationalisation, Internationalisation-FOR-ALL;
- Curriculum Internationalisation and Competence-Based student-centred HE;
- Curriculum Internationalisation and employability;
- Curriculum Internationalisation and global citizenship;
- Agents of Curriculum Internationalisation and their roles

At the outset Dr Ashok Gupta, Chancellor, IIS University, **welcomed** the delegates and shared with all the vision of management vis-à-vis Internationalisation at the IIS University. This was followed by Prof T. N Mathur, Vice-Chancellor's **address** on the topic.





Dr Raakhi Gupta, Rector & Registrar, IIS University and also the contact person and a participant of the RISHII project further acquainted the delegates with the objectives of the project and the purpose of the webinar. She also highlighted the need of Internationalization and its various benefits for the Institution.

The first session on **Internationalisation of HE: The Global Perspective**, was delivered jointly by Dr. Arti Sharma, Head, Department of Sociology and Dr. Himangini Hooja, Head, Department of Psychology. In this session the speakers reviewed the practice and profession of higher education through a broader and more globalized lens of internationalization, in order to expand the vision of what higher education is today and can be for the future

The second session was a recorded talk of Prof. Pankaj Mittal, the Secretary General, AIU who shared with all, the Government of India's initiatives and plans to evolve an **International friendly eco system in Indian Higher Education Institutions through the New Education Policy (NEP 2020)**. The talk gave us a direction to align University's strategic plan in light of the new education policy's directives/vision.

Internationalisation includes a broad range of elements right from the curriculum, teaching-learning, research, institutional agreements, students and faculty mobility, development co-operation and many more. However, in the recent years, curriculum has become the defining element of Internationalisation of Higher education. In the next session Prof Ila Joshi, Head, Department of Home Science, Dr Chhavi Jain, Department of Management and Dr Payal Mehtani, Co-ordinator, IQAC jointly enlightened the participants with some basic concepts of **Internationalisation of Curriculum focusing on Why and What for?** The session was instrumental in creating a learning & dynamic environment directed towards conscious change in approach to internationalization.

The session on **Connecting Curriculum Internationalisation with Global citizenship and graduate employability** was delivered jointly by Dr Neha Batra and Dr Anju Singh. In their talk they emphasized on how an internationalized curriculum engenders Global Citizenship(GC) in graduates to prepare them for life-skills, employment and employability.



They deliberated on the fact that the University now has to focus on inculcating specific skill sets amongst its students through its innovative and Internationalised curricula and learner-centric teaching.

The final session was specifically on **IISU's strategic plan for internationalization**, which was delivered by Prof Vijay Singh Rathore, Director IISU's International cell who shared with all the preparedness and planning of IISU International Cell and the strategic plan for way forward in the direction of Internationalisation.

The **closing remarks** were given by Prof K.S. Sharma, Advisor, IISU.

The feedback from attendees was taken through a google sheet, shared with them at the end of the programme. Feedback received from the participants indicated that the seminar objectives were clearly defined and met and the dissemination further enhanced the understanding of concepts of internationalization and its adoption in the Institution. Overall the level of satisfaction of all attendees is more than 95%, however some of the suggestions that were received are the following:

- Specific workshops to be organized wherein, discussions and deliberations on internationalization of subject specific curricula be undertaken.
- Elaboration on Internationalization assessment tools be done
- Pre-assessment tool/questionnaire may also be given besides the post feedback questionnaire so as to assess the actual learning outcome.

The attendees also shared the following as best practice-

- Well organised and well-planned workshop
- All contents were presented through PPTs in compact way
- Clear and objective discussions.
- The conceptual clarity of the speakers
- Interactive involvement
- Multiple resource persons with short lectures
- Time Punctuality



- Well- articulated Content-layout & presentation
- Internationalization of Curriculum, and views on NEP 2020

It is suggested in the feedback received from the resource persons and the attendees that an increase in the duration of the workshop may enhance the dissemination outcomes. The increased duration will give enough time to add interactive tasks/activities pertaining to internationalization of specific curriculum. With the hands on training it might become a workshop in true sense.

The webinar was an empowering experience for all of us. We were successful in creating informal intellectual spaces for discussion on internationalization of curriculum across various departments. We realized that we have enormous potential for internationalization in academics and research. We need to build friendly and inclusive education system which is synergistic with global needs. The seminar was an excellent opportunity to bring together the action agents (stakeholders) of Internationalisation on the same platform across faculties/departments. Overall experience of the seminar for all of us has been very good. It has consolidated, deepened and broadened the learning of not only delegates but also of the RISHII participants of IISU (level1 badge achievers). In fact it has had the Protégé effect on the RISHII consortium in true sense.

## II Dissemination activity – October 9, 2021

### Topic

## Transformation of Higher Education: Internationalization of Curriculum

### A Reflection Report

A national webinar on Transformation of Higher Education: Internationalization of Curriculum was organised on October 9, 2021 by IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur. During planning stage of the workshop, we had set the target for 30 participants but overwhelming response for the workshop was received. A total of 296 participants from Andhra Pradesh, Goa, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal and South America registered for the webinar. **Dr. Ashok Gupta**, Chancellor, IIS (deemed to be University), delivered the welcome address. He extended a warm welcome to the resource persons and all the participants. He stated that the NEP 2020 has charted out a roadmap for making internationalization of higher education in India a reality by 2030. In this context, it is imperative to understand the concept of internationalization of higher education. IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur has taken initiative to deliberate on this issue and expose the participants to the much needed discourse on opportunities and challenges associated with internationalization of curriculum. **Prof. T N Mathur**, Vice Chancellor, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur highlighted the importance of internationalization of curriculum in Higher Education. He motivated the participants to adopt various aspects of Internationalization of higher education in their respective institutions. **Prof. Raakhi Gupta**, Registrar, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur presented a comprehensive overview of the webinar. The event was moderated by Dr. Rimika Singhvi, Head, Department of English, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur. The inaugural talk was delivered by **Prof. Sandeep Sancheti**, Vice Chancellor, Marwadi University, Rajkot, Gujarat. He discussed at length about foreign education bill and New Education Policy 2020. He also highlighted various dimensions of globalization of workforce, international research collaboration in the wake of COVID Pandemic and use of innovations.





The webinar comprised of four technical sessions. The resource person for technical session I was **Dr. Chetan Singhai**, Deputy Director, Ramaiah Public Policy Centre, Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences, Bengaluru. His expert talk focused on Internationalisation of Curriculum –What and Why? He discussed about the policy implementation at various levels of an institution, current perspective and future directions. She reflected on Curriculum Internationalization with global citizenship and employability of graduates. She elaborated on embedding employability skills with the learning outcomes and incorporating the content to enhance the real work relevance of the skills. The resource persons for technical session III were **Prof Ila Joshi**, Head, Department of Home Science, IIS (deemed to be University), **Dr. Payal Mehtani**, Coordinator, IQAC, IIS (deemed to be University), **Dr. Chhavi Jain**, Associate Professor, Department of Management Studies, IIS (deemed to be University). The theme of this session was on Inclusion of International, Intercultural and global elements in the curriculum. Dr. Ila Joshi discussed about the elements of curriculum, Dr. Chhavi Jain deliberated on the process of internationalization of curriculum and Dr. payal Mehtani highlighted the various aspects of teaching and learning arrangements. Technical session IV was on the topic Establishment of International affairs office on campus. The resource person for the same was **Prof. Vijay Singh Rathore**, Director, International Cell, IIS (deemed to be University). He discussed about the need of establishing IRO and the activities to be conducted by IRO. Closing remarks were delivered by **Prof K S Sharma**, Advisor, IIS (deemed to be University).

Overall, the webinar was a very successful endeavour in achieving the goals for engaging faculty, students, non-teaching staff to think through best practices of internationalization and reviewing concepts. The university wishes to put on record the contribution of the resource persons and excellent support of university consortium members who helped in disseminating the information about the webinar. The webinar has helped to design a roadmap for the implementation of internationalization of curriculum. Concrete step by step planning in a phased manner is required for internationalization of curriculum since Indian education system is massive, diverse and complex. The webinar focused to raise awareness of the changing landscape of higher education to foster the growth of





internationalisation in higher education. The precise and in-depth knowledge of the experts delivered through explicit sessions has helped to enrich knowledge on the various aspects of internationalization of curriculum. Since, workshops are group experiences, the webinar was also successful in creating an environment where the participants could further connect and contribute towards the implementation of internationalization of curriculum. The webinar also emphasised on pragmatic ways to shape the future of study abroad and international higher education. Moreover, participation in the sessions organised by the other partner institutions helped to broaden our horizon regarding different dimensions of curriculum internationalization.

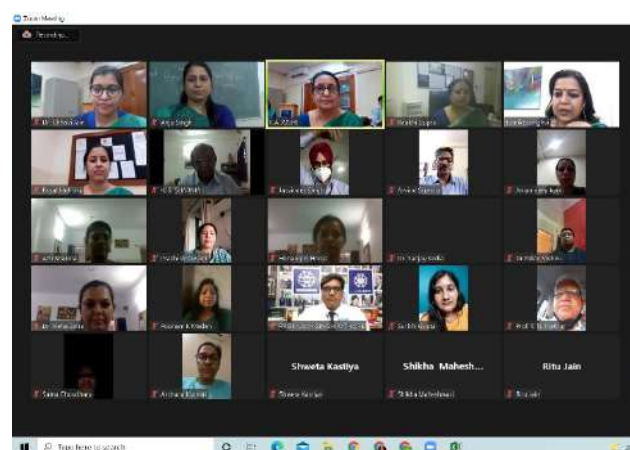
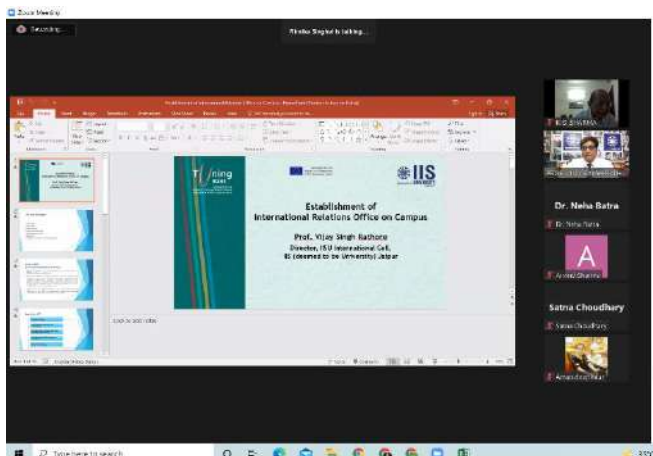
Majority of the participants were satisfied with the content and presentations of the webinar, however some of the suggestions that were received are the following:

- Key skills for employability
- Offline sessions which are more participative should be organized
- Discipline wise information can be incorporated
- There should be a session on pedagogical aspects and capacity building of faculties to make the internationalisation of curriculum more effective
- More encouragement for providing and offering large number of free ships and scholarships to their students

Constructive feedback was received regarding time duration of different sessions, and organising such sessions in offline mode. The attendees also shared the following as best practice-

- Well planned, and highly experienced speakers
- The policies which we got to know about opened many opportunities
- Lectures are well prepared and clearly meet the objective.
- Presentation method
- Resource persons
- Internalisation of curriculum as per the NEP 2020
- Selection of resource persons
- Small sessions
- Eminent speakers' talks, choice of topics, time management

Further, some improvements in the conduct of the webinar were suggested based on the feedback taken from the participants. Subject specific webinars with different target groups can be organised. In order to create a better impact of the workshop and improve the learning curve of the participants, offline workshops can be organised, which may be more interactive and activity based. The duration of the sessions can be increased from one day to two days in the future. Collaborative seminars can be organised with RISHII partner institutions to promote curriculum internationalization.

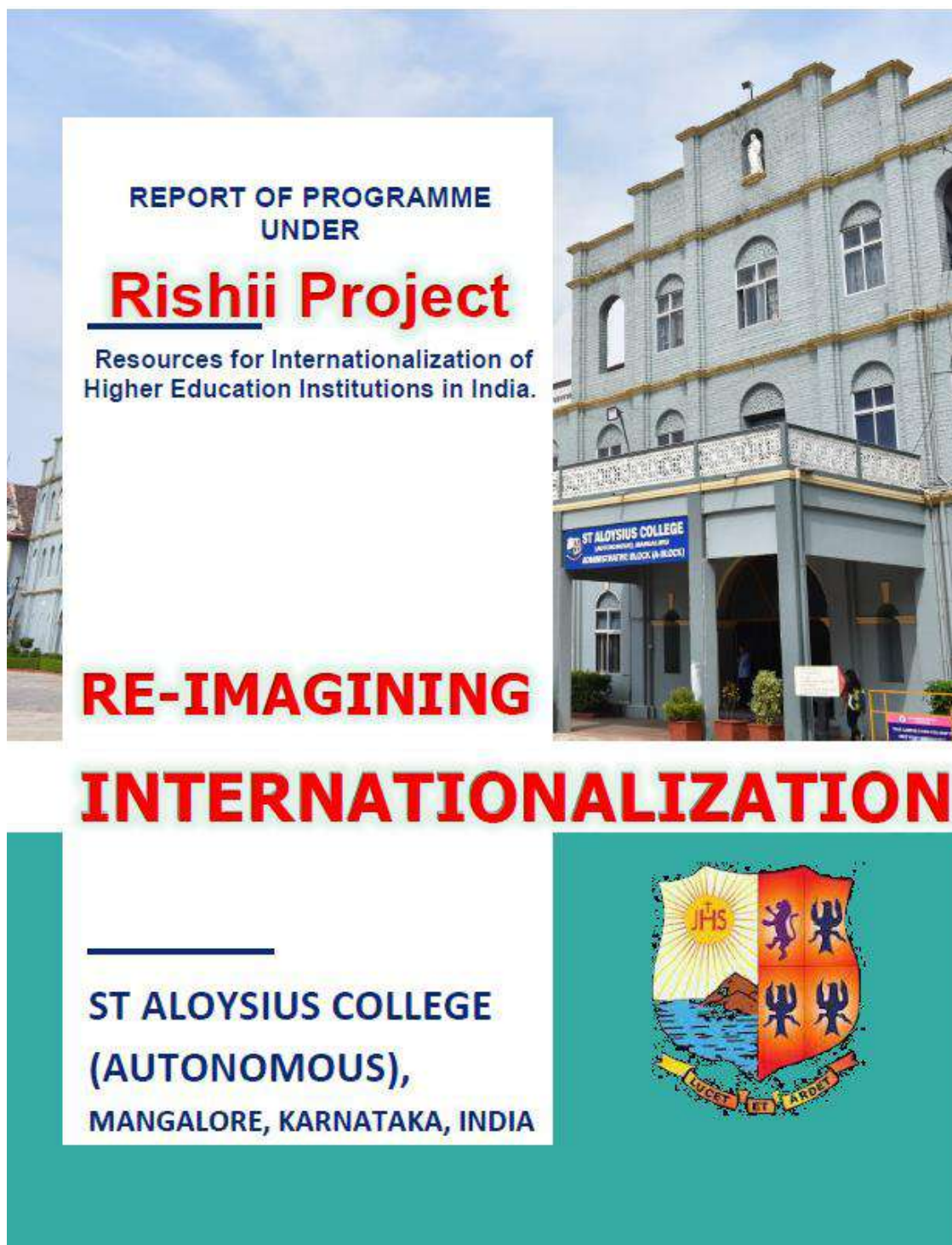
